St. Bernard Medal

St. Bernard Stirling Medal

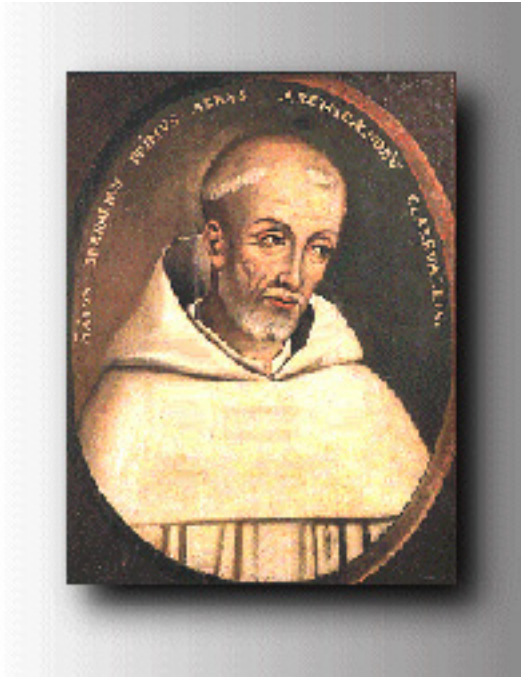
Mutt said "Isn't that the Saint Bernard Dog Medal" they give to Mountain Climbers? Jeff replied "I don't think so, there was a Saint Bernard and you will have to look it up on the Internet." Thus started a long search for the facts.

The earliest written records of the St. Bernard dogs are from monks at the hospice at the Great St Bernard Pass in 1707. St. Bernard dogs are no longer used for alpine rescues.

St. Bernards are often portrayed, especially in old live action comedies such as Swiss Miss, the TV series Topper, and classic cartoons wearing small barrels of brandy around their necks. A frequent joke in old MGM and Warner Brothers shorts is to depict the dogs as compulsive alcoholics who engage in frequent nips from their own casks. This was supposedly used to warm the victims that the dogs found. The monks of the St. Bernard Hospice deny that any St. Bernard has ever carried casks or small barrels around their necks; they believe that the origin of the image is an early painting.



St. Bernard of Clairvaux 1090 - 1153 Abbott and Doctor of the Church.

He was a Frankish abbot and the primary builder of the reforming Cistercian monastic order. After the death of his mother, Bernard sought admission into the Cistercian order. Three years later, he was sent to found a new abbey at an isolated clearing in a glen known as the Val d’Absinthe, about 15 km southeast of Bar-sur-Aube. According to tradition, Bernard founded the monastery on 25 June 1115, naming it Claire Vallée, which evolved into Clairvaux. There Bernard would preach an immediate faith, in which the intercessor was the Virgin Mary. In the year 1128, Bernard assisted at the Council of Troyes, at which he traced the outlines of the Rule of the Knights Templar, who soon became the ideal of Christian nobility.

On the death of Pope Honorius II, which occurred on February 14, 1130, a schism broke out in the Church. King Louis VI convened a national council of the French bishops at Étampes, and Bernard was chosen to judge between the rival popes. In 1139, Bernard assisted at the Second Council of the Lateran. Bernard denounced the teachings of Peter Abelard to the Pope, who called a council at Sens in 1141 to settle the matter. Bernard soon saw one of his disciples, Bernard of Pisa, elected Pope. Having previously helped end the schism within the Church, Bernard was now called upon to combat heresy. In June 1145, Bernard traveled in Southern France and his preaching there helped strengthen support against heresy.

Following the Christian defeat at the Siege of Edessa, the Pope commissioned Bernard to preach the Second Crusade. The last years of Bernard’s life were saddened by the failure of the crusaders, the entire responsibility for which was thrown upon him. Bernard died at age 63, after 40 years spent in the cloister. He was the first Cistercian monk placed on the calendar of saints, and was canonized by Pope Alexander III on 18 January 1174. Pope Pius VIII bestowed upon him the title of “Doctor of the Church.”

Becouse of the price of a cup of coffee they think this is 1940's era.



The next token. Obverse: *Nedilicks nickel*, below head of Mr. Nedlick, EAT BETTER FOR LESS, around above. Reverse: REDEEMABLE FOR / 5 c / PURCHASE / OF FOOD OR DRINK / IN NEDICKS STORES / BEFORE DEC. 1959 AROUND BELOW. 19MM aluminum We found that there were many Nediliks stores which sell Nedilicks Orange Drink. Just think in 1959 a bottle of soda pop for Five Cents.

The next token is bronze octagon. Obverse: WORLDS / GREATEST / SHOW, between two musical notes, PLACE Reverse: SHOW ' WORLD ' CENTER above silhouette of lady between two musical notes, 8 AVE. / N.Y.C. / 42 St. 20mm bronze The "SHOW WORLD CENTER" in Time Square has a web site.

The next bronze token. Obverse: * FAMILY AMUSEMENT *, above around, pinball machine in center / TOKEN, below 23mm bronze. Not any additional data on this pinball token.

The Last aluminum token. Obverse: AMERICAN ASSOCIATION, above around, oil well derricks in center, of PETROLEUM LANDMEN ' around below. Reverse: LAND IS THE BASIS, around above, THIRTEENTH / ANNUAL / MEETING / JUNE 21 – 24, 1967/ New ORLEANS / OF ALL WEALTH, around below. 36mm aluminum.
